- **Recruit spouses and family members** to join your Lions Club.
- **Do recruiting of businesses in your club's area.** This is how almost all clubs get started. Is it time to ask new businesses and new members of the community to become Lions? Invite local business people to your open meeting/house.
- **Select two "Super Recruiters" from your club.** Every club has one or two members who bring in the most new Lions. Designate these as your SUPER RECRUITERS and challenge them to be the first to add two new members to your club.
